


Our mission: to support individuals so they can successfully *live, work* and *learn* in the *community*.

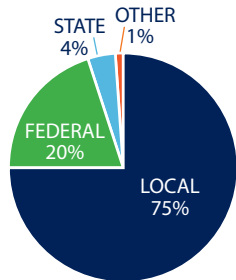
WHERE DOES THE MONEY COME FROM?

Revenues provide funding to pay for services for people with developmental disabilities.

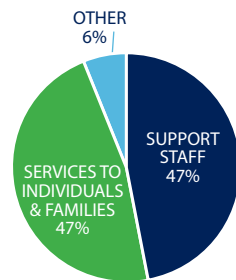
 Our primary source of funding is from property tax levies collected annually. The Board was last on the ballot in 2004.

 For every \$4 we spend of local tax levy dollars, we receive \$6 in federal Medicaid funds to provide services so people with disabilities are able to live, work and lead meaningful lives in Butler County.

All services for people with developmental disabilities are paid for by local tax dollars, and state and federal funds.

services for children

We provide in-home support & coaching to families with children under 3 years old.

support coordination

We arrange for support for people aged 3 years old and up through their lifetime, if needed. Service plans are developed with individuals and families to design supports provided through partner agencies.

services for adults

Provider agencies offer programs to individuals that support them to engage in their community through recreation and employment. Provider agencies also offer job training and development so people can find work in the community. Board staff support people to plan their day.

community inclusion

We support people so they can participate in all aspects of community life, advocate, and speak up for themselves.

quality assurance

We investigate health and safety issues, and we monitor and offer support to provider agencies.
