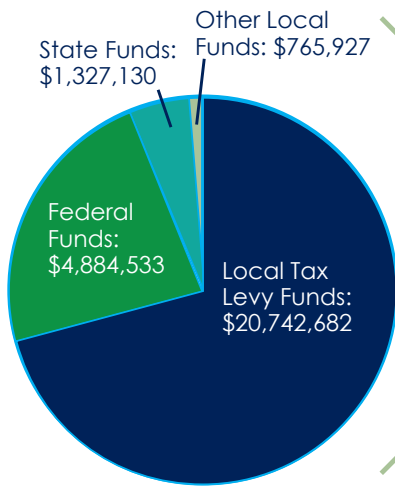


What do my tax dollars pay for?

2015 revenue by funding source



Butler County tax payers fund 74 percent of the Board's \$27.7 million budget. The other 26 percent of funding comes from federal, state, and local sources.

economic impact

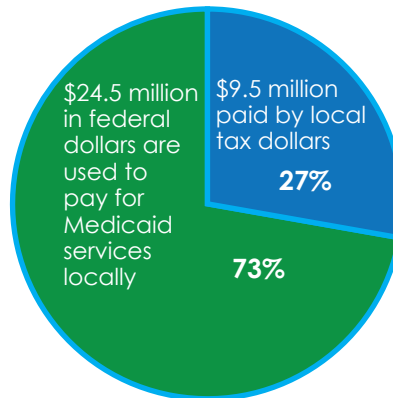
Our 2015 annual budget was \$29.7 million, but our economic impact is much larger. In the last five years, we have brought \$250 million to Butler County from services provided or purchased. Through our Board and through the more than 100 partner agencies and providers we contract with, 1,500 people are employed to support people with developmental disabilities throughout our community.

funding follows the person

Through our person-centered planning process, services are chosen by the person and then paid for by local tax dollars and state and federal funds.

For every \$4 we spend of local tax levy dollars, \$6 in federal funds are used to provide Medicaid services so people with disabilities are able to live, work and lead meaningful lives in Butler County.
