



Adult Services

The Butler County Board of MRDD offers a number of services for adults. We can assist adults interested in paid work, volunteer work, habilitation and recreation. We help individuals with developmental disabilities, who have brain injuries and senior citizens with disabilities.

Choosing the most appropriate service...

Each individual will be evaluated to determine the most appropriate services based on specific needs and preferences as well as the availability of services. An Individual Service Plan, an annual roadmap for goals and services, is developed before an individual enters the program. Individuals and their families will participate in a review of their ISP at least one time per year.

Vocational Services

Facility-based services – are designed to assist individuals in developing work skills in a supervised setting. Program participants will be provided paid work by Miami Valley Industries and supervised by Board staff. Steps of each job are appropriately assigned to match individual skill levels to the work. Workers are paid according to how fast they complete their work.

Supported Employment – is designed to assist individuals who want to work in the community. Individuals can go in groups, called enclaves or work crews. This opportunity provides individuals with exposure to a community work setting, but with staff supervision. Assistance can be provided for job development, training, and retention at a community job site. This is done in conjunction with our partnership with the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation and other contract agencies, such as: Miami Valley Industries, Abilities First, Jewish Vocational Services, and Goodwill Industries.

Habilitation Services

The habilitation service options are non-vocational and provide for more independence and community integration opportunities. Services may include self care/domestic needs, self advocacy, education, Jazzercise, fine arts, community participation and leisure activities. The following services may be available:

- Senior services – focuses on the particular interests of older adults. This program also accesses resources in the community designed for older adults.
- Specialized services for people with brain injuries – advocates for individuals with brain injuries in every aspect of daily living and reintroduces them into their community and to resources outside of MRDD services.
- Community Integration – offers volunteer, recreational, and educational activities within the community. These services may be provided individually or in groups.

- Leisure/Recreation – helps individuals find and participate in various activities of their choice within their community. Leisure recreation coaches are available for individuals who need assistance with participation and/or transportation. We also link individuals to Job Club, Friendship Club, Therapeutic Recreation, and Special Olympics.
- Transportation – may be available upon request and includes a cost.

Who is eligible?

Butler County residents are eligible for Adult Services if they have a life long mental or physical disability that occurred before the age of 22. Individuals must have substantial limitations in at least three of seven areas: self care, communication, learning, mobility, self-direction, capacity for independent living, and economic self sufficiency.
